- **PROGRAM ENROLLMENT** – Students interested in working toward the Certificate in Global Legal Studies typically enroll in the program after completing one year of law school. Effective January 1, 2006, no student may enroll during his or her last two semesters. Enrollment Forms are available online\* or from Professor Susan Tiefenbrun.
- **CERTIFICATE APPLICATION** – Candidates for the Certificate in Global Legal Studies, who are enrolled and participating in the program, complete an application form at the start of their last semester of law school so that their credentials can be reviewed. Certificate application forms are available online\* or from Professor Tiefenbrun.
- **PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENT** – Students enrolled in the program and working toward a Certificate must show a reasonable, good faith level of participation in Center-related events and activities. *Candidates must fill out an Event Attendance Log and summarize their activities when applying for the Certificate.* The Event Attendance Log Form is available online\* or from Professor Susan Tiefenbrun.
- **WRITING REQUIREMENT** – Students admitted to law school in the Fall 2005 semester or later must fulfill a Substantial Writing Requirement. The same paper may fulfill both the Substantial Writing Requirement and the law school's general Upper Level Writing Requirement. *Students admitted prior to the Fall 2005 semester need not fulfill this requirement.*
- **THE UNITS REQUIREMENT** – Certificate candidates must earn a total of at least 12 elective units from Center-eligible graded classroom courses at TJSL, from eligible TJSL non-classroom units (e.g. Directed Study), or from approved and eligible non-TJSL units (e.g. courses taken in the Nice International Law Program). Students may take up to 4 credits of combined and approved Directed Study or 4 credits of non-TJSL units and TJSL non-classroom units. - **THE GPA REQUIREMENT** – Certificate candidates admitted to law school in the Fall 2005 semester must graduate with at least a 2.5 overall GPA and at least a 2.7 Center GPA. *Students admitted prior to the Fall 2005 semester must graduate with at least a 2.2 overall GPA and at least a 2.2 Center GPA.*
